Life is not easy at times. We've all been in situations that are difficult, in places we'd not rather be, but we "hang in there" because of strong motives which involve love and loyalty. Learning to Soar By David Ferguson

I am fascinated by eagles. I believe most people are. They really are so majestic looking in flight. The eagle is our national bird, and it has also been the national bird of other nations in the past, such as Rome. The eagle has often been the symbol of vigor and vitality. David saw the eagle as a symbol of strength, too. He says in Psalm103: 2, 5, 2 Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: 5 Who satisfieth thy mouth with good things; so that thy youth is renewed like the eagle's.

With those examples in mind, I want us to see how God's word teaches us that not only are eagles fascinating, amazing and symbolic of strength, they really do help us to see ourselves. The eagle's nest shows us how we will grow into maturity. It's not only a nursery for the young, it's their school, too. Job 39:27-30 says, 27 Doth the eagle mount up at thy command, and make her nest on high? 28 She dwelleth and abideth on the rock, upon the crag of the rock, and the strong place. 29 From thence she seeketh the prey, and her eyes behold afar off. 30 Her young ones also suck up blood: and where the slain are, there is she."

Location is very important to the eagle and its young. If possible, eagles build their nests on the face of cliffs. They don't build a nest in a tree unless they absolutely have to, be- cause a nest in a tree can be easily accessed. They don't build it on the top of the cliff, either, because on the top of a cliff it can be violated, too. Eagles build their nests in some inaccessible place.

The nest of an eagle is built with consummate expertise. It's not built using little twigs, but with great branches woven together in an immensely skillful way. If somehow an eagle's nest is loosed from its moorings and falls, it rarely comes apart. In fact, eagles' nests are so big they have weighed in at half a ton! And they are very comfortable, too. Their centers are carefully lined with feathers and leaves, and the eggs are placed there.

When they hatch, the mother begins the process of feeding the babies. Eventually, she will teach her little ones how to fly through demonstration. Little by little, the mother will swoop down on the nest and push the eaglets closer to the edge. Even before the eaglet can fly itself, the mother will push it out of the nest, then swoop down and catch it on her back. The mother eagle will do this over and over to teach her child how to fly, how to soar!

Like the eagle, at times, our heavenly Father pushes us in the direction we need to go to soar!

And what parents haven't experienced stormy periods with their children? Some of us have had to endure some bitter times and we've shed bitter tears (cf. Proverbs 10:1; Proverbs 17:25). In raising our children, maybe we've endured an insult or two along the way. Yet, we haven't given up because we want to do our best in bringing up our children "in the training and admonition of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4 NKJV). Our enduring love for them is similar to our Lord's enduring love for us (1 John 3:16; 1 John 4:8-11).

Brethren, knowing the deep, caring, and abiding love that our heavenly Father has for each one of us (John 3:16-17; Romans 5:8-10; 1 John 4:9-10), let's "hang in there," never leaving our post of duty and devotion, firmly planted in His divine and eternal love (1 Corinthians 15:58; cf. 1 Corinthians 13:13; 2 Peter 1:1-4).




