Interesting Facts

- 2 Corinthians has 13 chapters, 257 verses, 6046 words and can be read by the average reader in about 40 minutes.
- This epistle was written by Paul wrote in the Fall of 56 from Philippi in Macedonia.
- Another letter to the Corinthian church is referenced 2 Cor. 7:8ff.
- The epistle gives us the fullest discussion of giving found in a single passage in the Bible.
- Pauline authorship of 1 Corinthians is rarely called into question. It is quoted by Polycarp, Irenaeus. Clement of Alexandria, and Tertullian. It is also listed in Marcion's Apostolicion.
- Written by Paul and called his Apologia Pro Vita Sua (A Defense of his life)
