- ❖ Authorship is Ezra at about 450 BC.
- ❖ The same words that close Chronicles opens Ezra.
- ❖ Hebrew title is “dibre hayyamim” meaning “words of the days.”
- ❖ The writer uses multiple historical sources: genealogies, documents, poems, prophecies, and other histories.
- ❖ 1 Chronicles has 29, chapters 942 verses, 20,365 words, and can be read in about 2 hours,

- The sons of Abraham; Isaac, and Ishmael (1:28)
