Interesting Facts

- ❖ Many scholars regard Isaiah as the greatest and most sublime of all the prophets.
- ❖ Jewish tradition claims that he was of royal blood, the cousin of King Uzziah and father in law of King Manasseh.
- ❖ Leather rolls discovered by chance in a cave near the north end of the Dead Sea in 1947 proved to be a complete manuscript of Isaiah written in Hebrew about 100 B.C., nearly 1,000 years earlier than the oldest known Hebrew text.
- ❖ In the New Testament there are 43 references to passages in Isaiah, most of which had to do with the glorious coming of Christ and His work of salvation.
- ❖ Isaiah has 66 chapters, 1,292 verses, 37,036 words and can be read in about 3 hours and 30 minutes.

Memorable Outline of Isaiah "A Miniature Bible"

- I. First Division - 39 chapters (Old Testament) - Emphasize God's judgment upon immoral and idolatrous men.
 - A. Prophetic - Chapters 1 - 35
 - B. Historic - Chapters 36 - 39
- II. Second Division - 27 chapters (New Testament) - Presents the grace of God in the promise of the redeemer, concluding with the final judgment.
 - A. Messianic - Chapters 40 - 66

Scheme of Redemption The Gospel of Redemption in the Old Testament

"But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all."(53:5-6)

4. God's judgment upon immorality and idolatry in Judah and surrounding nations.

6. The glorious hope of the Messiah's coming.
