- ❖ Authorship is most likely unknown although it could have been written by Job, who was a real person (Ezekiel 14:14, James 5:11).
- ❖ Job is a poetical drama based on historical facts.
- ❖ Victor Hugo said, "The book of Job is perhaps the greatest masterpiece of the human mind." Tennyson called it "the greatest poem, whether of ancient or modern literature."
- ❖ The book of Job "has been called a key to the whole Bible, and to man's history from creation to completed redemption.
- ❖ Job has 42 chapters, 1,070 verses, 18,098 words and can be read in about 1 hour and 45 minutes

### Scheme of Redemption The Faith of the Redeemed Tested in Suffering

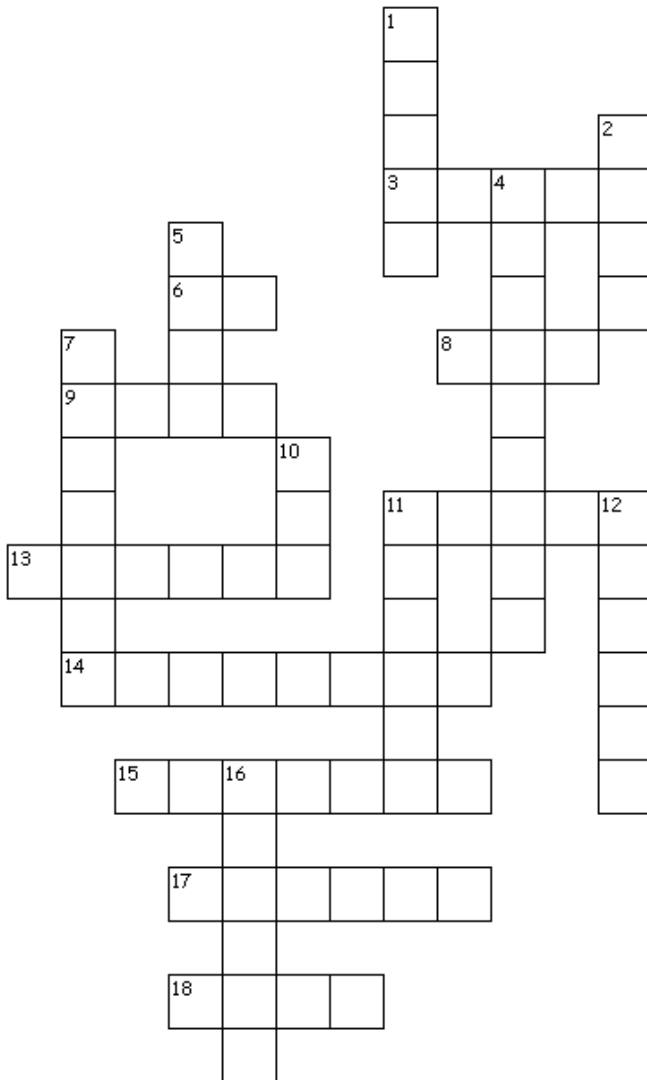
"Though he slay me, yet will I trust in him: but I will maintain mine own ways before him."
