
What to Look for as You Read

Interesting Facts

- Philemon contains 1 chapter, 25 verses, 430 words and can be read by the average person in 3 minutes.
- The book was written by Paul with Onesimus writing his dictation.
- Paul was in prison (likely the Roman imprisonment described at the close of Acts.
- The recipient of the letter, Philemon was married to Apphia.
- Philemon & Apphia had a son Archippus and the church (at Colossae met in their house.
- The book of Philemon is:
 - Paul's only one chapter book
 - Paul's shortest book
 - A very personal letter
 - One of Paul's four prison epistles along with Ephesians, Philippians and Colossians
